Dear Tax Tribunal Practitioner,

As part of the Tribunal's on-going efforts to streamline our hearing process, the Tribunal transitioned from a prehearing general call practice to a scheduling order practice. Although the scheduling order practice was designed to provide parties with more control over the processing of their appeals, it has created problems for both practitioners and the Tribunal. Such problems include, but are not limited to, submission of separate proposed scheduling orders rather than a stipulated proposed scheduling order, failure to submit a proposed scheduling order, processing of proposed scheduling orders after one or more of the dates stipulated to by the parties has passed, establishing of dates when no proposed scheduling orders are submitted, and continued processing of requests for extensions of time for the filing and exchange of valuation disclosures.

As a result, the Tribunal is proposing to arrange a meeting in the Detroit area to discuss:

- a. the revision of the current proposed scheduling order practice;
- b. the adoption of a combined scheduling order/prehearing general call practice; or,
- c. a return to a prehearing general call practice.
