## **Judge Victoria Enyart's Passing**

In the event that you have not heard, we regretfully inform you that Judge Victoria Enyart passed away on October 7, 2024, after a courageous battle with ALS. Judge Enyart retired on June 28, 2024, after approximately 20 years of service to the State of Michigan as the Tribunal's assessor member. Judge Enyart was first appointed to the Tribunal in 1999 by Governor Engler, and was appointed or reappointed by every subsequent Governor, namely Governors Granholm, Synder, and Whitmer. During her tenure, Judge Enyart presided over countless Entire Tribunal and Small Claims hearings. Of note is *Midland Cogeneration Venture v City of Midland*, the Tribunal's longest case, which lasted approximately six months. In 2013, she was awarded the Tax Judge of the Year by the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy. In her spare time, Judge Enyart was a talented crafter. She enjoyed sewing, embroidery, and creating beautiful pieces of stained glass.

Judge Enyart was a valued colleague who worked tirelessly in support of the Tribunal and its employees. She will be deeply missed by her Tribunal family.
