


January 2019 Summary

In mid-March 2019, the Bureau of Labor Statistics released calendar year 2018 unemployment and employment data. Below are highlights from that release:





Unemployment Rate

- Michigan's unemployment rate fell from 4.6 percent in 2017 to 4.1 percent in 2018. Nationally, the unemployment rate dropped from 4.4 percent to 3.9 percent.
- In the last nine years, the Michigan unemployment rate has fallen by 9.6 percentage points.
- Michigan's 2018 unemployment rate represented the the state's lowest annual jobless rate since 2000. The 2018 national unemployment rate was the lowest annual U.S. jobless rate since 1969.

Wage and Salary Employment


- In 2018, overall Michigan wage and salary employment rose 1.1 percent. Nationally, employment rose 1.7 percent.
- In the goods-producing sector, Michigan employment rose 2.6 percent in 2018. The State's service providing employment increased 0.9 percent and government employment increased 0.5 percent.
- 2018 marked Michigan employment's eighth straight annual increase.

Interstate Comparisons

- In 2018, Michigan recorded the 15th highest annual unemployment rate among the 50 states. Among the five Great Lakes states, Michigan's 2018 unemployment rate ranked third.
- Michigan's 2018 wage and salary employment increase ranked 19th fastest among U.S. states. In 2018, Michigan recorded the fastest employment increase among the Great Lakes states.
- At 43.4 hours, Michigan recorded the fourth longest average workweek for manufacturing production workers.

Household Unemployment and Employment Page 2

- In January 2019, the Michigan unemployment rate remained unchanged from last month at 4.0 percent. In • January 2019, the national unemployment rate was up 0.1 of a percentage point to 4.0 percent.
- In January 2019, Michigan's unemployment rate was down 0.5 of a percentage point from a year ago. The • January U.S. unemployment rate decreased 0.1 of a percentage point from a year ago. Monthly unemployment rates fluctuate in part due to statistical sampling errors and data revisions.


- In January, the total number of people employed in Michigan rose 11,000 persons to 4,718,000 persons. • The labor force was up 12,000 persons. The statewide total number of unemployed workers rose 2,000 persons.
- United States employment totaled 156.7 million persons in January 2019. The labor force totaled 163.2 • million and there were 6.5 million unemployed in January.

Employment by Place of Work (Payroll) Page 3

• From January 2018 to January 2019, Michigan payroll employment increased by 47,000 jobs (1.1 percent). State payroll employment rose by 9,800 jobs in January from December. Nationally, January 2019 payroll employment rose 2,800,000 (1.9 percent) from a year ago. National employment rose 311,000 jobs in January.



Payroll Employment Growth January 2018 to January 2019

- In the goods-producing sector, Michigan payroll employment increased 2.7 percent in January from a year ago; employment in the private service-providing sector rose 0.8 percent. From a year ago, January national payroll employment rose 3.2 percent in the goods-producing sector and increased 2.0 percent in the private service-providing sector.
- At 43.2 hours, manufacturing weekly hours in Michigan were down 0.2 of an hour from last year.

Motor Vehicle Sales

- January 2019 U.S. light vehicle sales fell 4.7 percent from December 2018 and were down 2.6 percent from January 2018. January 2019 marked the 59th straight month that the light vehicle annualized sales rate exceeded 16.0 million units. In January 2019, the sales rate equaled 16.7 million units.
- U.S. sales of domestic light vehicles were down 1.8 percent between January 2018 and January 2019. Foreign sales fell 5.1 percent over the same period. As a result, the foreign share of U.S. light vehicle sales fell 0.6 of a percentage point to 22.6 percent in January 2019.
- Auto sales decreased 3.6 percent compared to last January, while light truck sales were down 2.1 percent from January 2018. As a result, January 2019 marked the 16th straight month in which the light truck share of total sales exceeded 65.0 percent. Year-over-year, heavy truck sales rose 24.9 percent in January 2019
 -- the 17th double-digit heavy truck y-o-y percent increase in the past 18 months.

Motor Vehicle Production

- At 151,222 units, January 2019 Michigan motor vehicle production was up 6.3 percent from January 2018. National production was essentially unchanged from last January. The three-month average of vehicle production (November 2018-January 2019) was down 10.7 percent in Michigan and down 0.1 percent nationally, compared to a year ago.
- In January 2019, Michigan car production was down 44.0 percent from a year ago while State truck production increased 26.1 percent. Nationally, January car production decreased 6.8 percent while U.S. truck production was up 2.6 percent.
- Michigan's share of national vehicle production rose 1.0 percentage point in January 2019 from its year-ago level to 16.6 percent. Michigan's share of car production decreased 6.4 percentage points while the State's share of truck production was up 3.5 percentage points.
