







Mid-Year 2019 Review







<u>Michigan Labor Market</u>

- In the first half of 2019 (2019H1), Michigan's average unemployment rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point from 2018H2 to 4.1 percent. Compared to a year ago, Michigan's 2019H1 unemployment rate was down 0.2 of a percentage point.
- Compared with 2018H1, Michigan's 2019H1 labor force was up 0.7 percent and household employment was up 1.0 percent.
- In 2019H1, Michigan's average wage and salary employment rose a net 32,600 jobs from a year ago. Manufacturing employment rose 8,500 jobs while leisure and hospitality jobs increased 7,400.

Vehicle Sales and Production


- Averaging a 16.9 million unit rate, 2019H1 U.S. light vehicle sales were down 310,000 units from 2018H2 and down 240,000 units from 2018H1.
- Over the past year, the auto sales rate fell 450,000 units while the light truck sales rate rose 210,000.
- Between 2018H1 and 2019H1, total Michigan auto production fell 123,108 units (-45.5 percent) and State truck production was up 153,380 units (21.9 percent).
- In 2019H1, Michigan's share of national vehicle production (18.0 percent) was up by 0.8 of a percentage point compared to 2018H1.

U.S. Major Economic Indicators

- Between 2018H1 and 2019H1, average real GDP rose 2.5 percent.
- Compared to a year earlier, average consumer and producer indices fell in 2019H1.
 - The average consumer sentiment index was down 2.2 points, but remained historically high.
 - Both the average ISM manufacturing index and the ISM non-manufacturing index fell from a year ago, but both indices' 2019H1 averages signaled continued sector and economy growth.
- Average industrial production rose a modest 2.2 percent between 2018H1 and 2019H1 with the average capacity utilization rate rising a slight 0.1 point. Average 2019H1 retail sales were up 3.1 perent from a year earlier.

Household Unemployment and Employment Page 2

- In June 2019, the Michigan unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4.2 percent. In June 2019, the • national unemployment rate rose 0.1 of a percentage point to 3.7 percent.
- In June 2019, Michigan's unemployment rate rose 0.2 of a percentage point from a year ago. The June • 2019 U.S. unemployment rate decreased 0.3 of a percentage point from a year ago. Monthly unemployment rates fluctuate in part due to statistical sampling errors and data revisions.


- In June, the total number of people employed in Michigan rose 2,000 persons to 4,748,000 persons. The • State labor force was up 4,000 persons. The statewide total number of unemployed workers rose 3,000 persons.
- United States employment totaled 157.0 million persons in June 2019. The labor force totaled 163.0 • million and there were 6.0 million unemployed in June.

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Employment by Place of Work (Payroll) Page 3

• From June 2018 to June 2019, Michigan payroll employment increased by 18,700 jobs (0.4 percent). State payroll employment rose by 5,400 jobs in June from May. Nationally, June 2019 payroll employment rose 2,301,000 (1.5 percent) from a year ago. National employment rose 224,000 jobs in June.



Payroll Employment Growth June 2018 to June 2019

- In the goods-producing sector, Michigan payroll employment increased 1.1 percent in June from a year ago; employment in the private service-providing sector rose 0.3 percent. From a year ago, June national payroll employment rose 2.0 percent in the goods-producing sector and increased 1.7 percent in the private service-providing sector.
- At 41.7 hours, manufacturing weekly hours in Michigan were down 1.5 hours from last year.



Motor Vehicle Sales

- June 2019 U.S. light vehicle sales fell 0.6 percent from May 2019 but were up 0.4 percent from June 2018. June 2019 marked the 64th straight month that the light vehicle annualized sales rate exceeded 16.0 million units. In June 2019, the sales rate equaled 17.3 million units.
- U.S. sales of domestic light vehicles were up 2.0 percent between June 2018 and June 2019. Foreign sales fell 5.0 percent over the same period. As a result, the foreign share of U.S. light vehicle sales fell 1.3 percentage points to 22.4 percent in June 2019.
- Auto sales decreased 5.4 percent compared to last June, while light truck sales were up 2.9 percent from June 2018. As a result, June 2019 marked the 5th straight month in which the light truck share of total sales exceeded 70.0 percent. Year-over-year (y-o-y), heavy truck sales rose 12.2 percent in June 2019 -- the 25th straight y-o-y increase in heavy truck sales and the 20th double-digit increase over the past 23 months.

Motor Vehicle Production

- At 164,274 units, June 2019 Michigan motor vehicle production was up 5.7 percent from June 2018. National production was down 1.5 percent from last June. The three-month average of vehicle production (April 2019-June 2019) was up 4.5 percent in Michigan and up 0.9 percent nationally, compared to a year ago.
- In June 2019, Michigan car production was down 34.3 percent from a year ago while State truck production increased 15.9 percent. Nationally, June car production decreased 10.4 percent while U.S. truck production was up 1.6 percent.
- Michigan's share of national vehicle production rose 1.3 percentage points in June 2019 from its yearago level to 18.3 percent. Michigan's share of car production decreased 3.6 percentage points while the State's share of truck production was up 2.6 percentage points.
