MR. FRANK: I had a question about the - the ordinance regulating donation boxes. I know that's been upand-down for a while. But a number - there's a number of communities have been engaged in litigation over the - the constitutionality of those, and I just wanted to know whether we have reviewed - whether the City has reviewed that with our attorney and made the appropriate changes to make it as least litigation-friendly possible -

MS. SCHAFER: Mr. Kibby.

MR. FRANK: - with - notwithstanding some of us are lawyers.

MR. KIBBY: Mr. - Committee Chair, we did work with the City Attorney on that. I believe it is based on the - the community on the west side of the state had a - that has had successful issues with their ordinance and dealing with - I believe it was Planet - Planet Aid, and dealing with them. So our City Attorney, Joe Couvreur, did work with the litiga (sic) - or the - our commission - our committee that does the ordinances to make sure that - that was there with no issues. I believe they had that for about six months that they've been working on that.

MR. FRANK: Thank you.

MR. CLINE: If I may - if I may add one thing, just - just for the benefit of the Board, when our staff in our office reviews any of the RTAB packets, anytime there's an

ordinance that may come before the Board, we always check with the community to make sure that their legal counsel has - has read the - the particular ordinance to make sure that they've at least had a hand in developing, and if not developing it completely, to address questions, you know, just like that, and anything we are concerned about, we'll certainly bring to your attention, you know, prior to the meeting. So - but we - we do always check on that to see if legal counsel's been involved in the development of any ordinances, so.

MR. KIBBY: I can also add the - we'll just point that, additionally, the attorney did work with the attorneys from Planet Aid, which is one of the largest non-profit organizations, to make sure that there was no issues as well so we could avoid those litigation aspects.

MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.

MR. FRANK: Thank you.

I had one other question -

MS. SCHAFER: The next item of business is pertaining to the Rules of Procedure Amendments.

Mr. Cline, would you please provide a summary to the Board.

MR. CLINE: Yes, thank you.

We do have in the draft that's before you a couple of different amendments to the Rules of Procedure for the Board, which you'll notice article - or Section - excuse me - 4.1 does list out the Members of the Board by name. Since we've had some change of membership, we wanted to - to update that to reflect the new composition of the Board.

Furthermore, going back to a discussion we've had for several months now, Section 5.12, we had inserted some draft criteria that would permit the video recording of the Board meetings and this is based upon a discussion that my staff had with the City and the City Administrator, and those criteria that you see inserted into the - the Rules of Procedure reflect the conversations that we had with the City. We know they're slightly more generic than specifying a certain rule - you know, some specific channels or

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1	anything to account for in case things change in the future.
2	But - but there are - directly reflect of the discussion we
3	had and the agreement of the process of how - how this would
4	work. All the recording will be done by the City and they -
5	they will assume responsibility for - for that entire
6	process.
7	So, if the Board is approving of these changes, we
8	can get this finalized and then the recording should start,
9	I would assume, next month if the City's prepared to do so.
10	MR. FRANK: Move to approve the Amendment to the
11	Rules of Procedure in Section 5.12, adding that, and
12	revising/amending Section 4.1.
13	MR. WOLLENWEBER: Second.
14	MS. SCHAFER: It's been moved and - and supported.
15	Any further discussion?
16	Hearing none, all those in favor of amending the
17	Rules of Procedures, Section 4.1 and 5.12, say "aye."

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MS. SCHAFER: The next item is EM Order 2014 (dash) 055 (dash) 08 Amendments.

Again, Mr. Cline, could you please provide a summary?

MR. CLINE: Certainly. This is an order that was implemented by Emergency Manager Parker. It establishes and creates a disclosure team for the purposes of the issuance of municipal bonds and establishes a disclosure team that and is comprised of the City Administrator, the Mayor, and the Finance Director. In time of the implementation and adoption of the Order, it listed out those individuals by name. Given the - the changes in City Administrator and the Finance Director no longer being the Interim Administrator, it was time to make a change to that; and what we have done is we have redrafted the Order to be reflective of positions as opposed to specific names, and that way in the future should - should any - anyone change for whatever reason, we don't have to go back and amend this to add new names. just by position.

Just as a reminder to the Board, this is an EM Order Amendment, so any vote you take would be a recommendation to the State Treasurer to - to authorize this.

1	MS. SCHAFER: Are there any questions for Mr.
2	Cline?
3	MR. CLINE: Well, if I may add as well, we did make
4	these draft changes in consultation with the City. My
5	understanding is that they - they have seen the draft. This
6	is very simple, so, you know, don't see any particular
7	concerns. But - but they have - they have been onboard with
8.	this from - from the beginning:
9	MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.
10	Any questions or comments?
11	MR. WOLLENWEBER: I'll make the motion to approve

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Motion by Wollenweber, support by Lites, to approve the EM Order No. 2014-055-8 Amendment recommendation to the State Treasurer. Approved unanimously.

MS. SCHAFER: The next item of business is the Annual RTAB Evaluation.

And again, Mr. Cline.

MR. CLINE: Yes. In the appointment, rather, of the RTAB, the Governor assigned to the Board to conduct an Annual Evaluation of the community. In the development of the RTAB process, but - the annual evaluation process, Treasury staff has conducted the evaluations with the understanding and - and approval of the Board to begin to move forward. We've tried to tie the evaluation process to the communities, sort of their annual date, as to when the RTAB was appointed. I do apologize. I intended on putting this on last month's agenda since their due date is at the end of October, and we pretty much just simply forgot about But, it was - time to move forward with this. we're asking for today, you have a - a summary of the evaluation for the criteria that we will be looking at; just simply asking you to authorize us to move forward with this and then we'll begin that process, and then all the information we gather will be brought back to you. have discussed this with the City Administrator, and after

after your vote today, I'll discuss with him a little further how this works. But just to keep it very simple, we've tried to make this evaluation as - as simple and as straightforward as we possibly can. We've eliminated any sort of point system or a pass/fail rate, or any - anything of that nature. We've simply made this to be a "yes" or "no" type of evaluation, and the criteria that we use is criteria that any local government the processes that they should be doing anyway. For example, one of the questions is, "Does the community utilize a capital improvements plan?" Well, we know that the City already has that in place because that was one of the things that they had to develop at the appointment time of the RTAB. So, that is something very simple that they will meet that criteria, and as I said, we use a simple "yes/no" format.

"Are you doing it?
"Yes."

"If you are, how well is it working. If you're not, why haven't you done it? Have you not had time to get to it? Do you lack the resources?"

And if you give a host of reasons, and, "What is your plan to address it going forward?"

We just simply compile that information. It - you know, the answers will fall out however they fall out.

We'll bring that back to you. We also have a process to

allow for input and - and sort of a interview section for the RTAB Members to - to give your feedback into this process. When city staff - or when my staff sits down with the City, we'll sit down with - with the City Administrator, I'm - I'm assuming the Mayor as well, and possibly, the Finance Director. We - I mean we don't put any limits on on who needs to be involved, but they'll have a fair We've understanding of - of what we're gonna be discussing. done these in - in several other of the RTAB communities. They've all generally worked pretty well. I think this will be the third or fourth time we've done this, so we're still working on a kink here or there. But, generally, we've been pretty happy with it, and what we're asking for today is you to just give us the go ahead to - to start this process because I don't want it to take too long because it - it is somewhat time consuming to develop and get everything scheduled, and - and then get it written up properly to bring back to you. And then at the end, once final approval is given, a report does go to the Governor, the - the local community gets a copy, the State Treasurer gets a copy; and we have tried to design it reflective of the reporting requirements in Public Act 436, so we send a copy to the State Senator and State Representative's offices that - that represent Allen Park. So we try and mirror that as much as we can and that way everyone that needs to know is aware of

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1 how well the process is working, so. 2 So if there's any questions, it's fairly 3 straightforward at this point and -4 MR. LITES: How long does the evaluation normally 5 take? 6 MR. CLINE: Well, to actually sit down with the 7 City and go through all of it, it's probably a couple hours 8 It depends on how much we end up talking about any 9 particular point. And then to go back and write it up, let's say, you know, go through a couple drafts of it and 10 11 everything, it probably takes a good couple of weeks. 12 were spursed (sic) with other projects and everything. 13 So, if we were able to sit down - I'm just trying 14 to think on the fly here - but if we - if we sat down, say, 15 sometime in early December with the City, we could possibly have a draft back for you by the January meeting, more 16 17 likely the February meeting. 18 MR. LITES: That's my question; right. 19 MR. CLINE: Yeah. 20 MR. LITES: We'd be anticipating getting the -21 getting the evaluation in - at the February meeting. 22 MR. CLINE: I'd say that's probably safe. You 23 know, I'll be honest, that if - sometimes we - we have a 24 little trouble with the - the timing on this because it's 25 sort of a new process for everybody, and - and like I said,

1	we have a little bit of trial and error trying to work out
2	some of the - the defects in it; but, I think we're getting
3	closer to a more streamlined process. So, I want to get
4	this one started early and get it over with, and - and get
5	it back to you as quickly as I can, so.
6	MS. SCHAFER: Any further questions for Mr. Cline?
7	Okay. I'll entertain a motion to approve, deny,
8	or postpone commencement of a Annual RTAB Evaluation.
9	MR. LITES: I would move to authorize conducting
10	the Evaluation.
11	MR. WOLLENWEBER: Second.
12	MS. SCHAFER: It's been moved and supported. All
13	those in favor of approving Treasury to commence the Annual
14	RTAB Evaluation, say "aye."
15	RTAB BOARD: Aye.
16	MS. SCHAFER: Opposed?
17	RTAB BOARD: (No response).
18	MS. SCHAFER: Hearing none, the Board has approved
19	Treasury to go ahead on the commencement of the Annual RTAB
20	Evaluation.
21	Motion by Lites, support by Wollenweber, to
22	approve the State Treasury to commence with the
23	Annual RTAB Evaluation. Approved unanimously.
24	MS. SCHAFER: The next item under City - Old - New
25	Business - I'm sorry - is the City - City Administrator

Items, of which there is none.

## NON ACTION ITEMS

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MS. SCHAFER: So we move onto the Non Action Items. The first of that is the Budget-to-Actual Report for September 2015. It has been submitted and filed, received and filed; as has the Quarterly Revenue & Expenditure Report. And is there any comments or questions on either of those?

MR. CLINE: I do - do not know if - if Mr.

Wollenweber or Mr. Lites have any questions related to these since this is their first meeting when you're looking at that. I didn't have any immediate commentary on it given that, you know, everyone has an opportunity to review it.

So, I don't know if we have any other - any other questions or anything?

MR. WOLLENWEBER: I went through it, and both of them in some detail; but, I just had some individual questions which I'll be happy to take up with staff later, just how they fund their define benefit or define contribution system. There weren't charges from some of the departments. The - had a con (sic) - one of the very specific ones is the - a fire grant. I assume that's a personnel grant or is that an equipment grant?

MR. KIBBY: There was the Safe (sic) - that should have been the SAFER grant, the -

1	MR. WOLLENWEBER: Oh, okay.
2	MR. KIBBY: - for personnel.
3	MR. WOLLENWEBER: For personnel. How come it's not
4	expended out? 'Cause you - I -
5	MS. SCHAFER: That -
6	MR. WOLLENWEBER: - I assume you're hiring.
7	MR. CADY: Because of the new grant.
8	MR. WOLLENWEBER: Is it just starting?
9	MR. KIBBY: Yeah, this - this was the renewal of
10	that grant.
11	MR. WOLLENWEBER: Okay, got it. I'm fine.
12	MS. SCHAFER: You're fine?
13	That brings us to the City Administrator Update.
14	Mr. Kibby.
15	MR. KIBBY: Let me get back up again.
16	Start off first with the - we had the election
17	last night and we did have a few new members coming onboard.
18	The Mayor Matakas was able to retain his position for
19	another 4 years.
20	And back in the audience here I see Councilman
21	Sisko and Councilman Templin were both reelected. And we
22	have two new members coming onboard: It'll be Councilman
23	Rourke and Councilwoman McLeod. And so, we're looking
24	forward to having them come on - join us here.
25	We also had a road millage which was approved. It

was - it was a little bit closer than we would have desired, but nonetheless, it was approved. It was for 1.9 mills for 10 years, and it'll generate about a million-four per year; so we're really looking forward to being able to go and start making some progress, and reevalue (sic) - re - redoing some roads and maintain some roads for long-term preventative maintenance which we have not been able to do for a number of years. So, it'll be a new change there.

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One of the things we were talking about that we did a couple of presentations for the residents through through this area - or through this facility here, and we had a number of people come in. I think the first presentation we had about a hundred and - about hundred twen (sic) - hundred - hundred people or so, and the second one we had about 35 to 40. And - but we were able to answer all the questions, had engineers here, had staff from DPS and And the - the key thing that we - we kept telling we - we've got to build trust, and we got to show the residents that we are capable of utilizing the tax dollars they've granted to us with the - with all the best intentions and the best product we can possibly put together So we do have a plan that we'll now be able to move forth on and start on that in the springtime. millage will actually be on the winter tax, so we'll be ready to go for the spring.

This is - since we last met, the Police Department has finally moved over to this com - complex completely. We are completely out of the old building. It has been shuttered, water turned off, the HVAC system is shut down. The police officers, I believe, are very happy to be over here. The air quality is much, much improved. They don't have to worry about leaks on their work areas and stations.

We do utilize a - a jail holding cell, a cage to hold the - anybody we bring in, and then they are processed and they are transported over to the City of Dearborn. I have not gone over there myself since this has gone through, but I understand that there was a welcoming message for those prisoners to their new housing facility there in Dearborn.

One of the things we are running into trouble with, though, is - is hiring of new police officers and also firefighters. And I know this is something that we talked about at the Council meetings, and if you are watching the - you know, watch the videos, you'll know it's come up a number of times. We - it seems like every time we're ready to hire an officer, they get a better offer from another community. So, we - we're looking at some other options as to how to - to maybe turn that trend, and so we're working with the - right now, we're gonna be working with the academies and see if we can get those people right from the

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ground floor and get 'em as they're coming right out. a little bit of an unusual step for - for Allen Park, as years ago, you know, an upwards of 250 people would apply for a position here for a police officer, and - and now we're down to - I think we had nine on the last round. And then you start eliminating them because of various reasons. So, it's a big change for us, so we're - we're gonna have to - we got to reevaluate how we do business and - and seeking those individuals out. And the same said (sic) - can be said for the fire department as they're running into the same situation. And I think a lot of it has to do with the - you know, it's not as favorable to be a police officer or firefighter at this point in time as it has been in the There - there - there's just not the - the respect past. out there as there once was, unfortunately. And - and we've also seen it come across in the DPS as well, and, you know, we know the wages are low, but it is what we - what we have to deal with, and so we're trying to find the right - right peo (sic) - personnel to fit those spots.

Since we've also met there (sic), we have had - we did submit a - the - the distressed cities grant to the state. We had four projects totaling a million, one twen (sic) - \$1,129,000.00 for the four projects. They included HVA system - let me go back. They included street lighting for the overall street lighting of the - of the community

going to an LED system, which had a savings of - of about a hundred and twenty thousand per year - or I'm sorry - eighty thousand on that; and then HVA system at the fire station, which also would have a - a significant - significant savings for the City. We have a parking and security upgrades for this facility here, as well as the Community Center; and - what am I missing on the third - fourth -

MR. CADY: The generator.

MR. KIBBY: Oh, yes, an important aspect to this building is a generator that would be portable, which we'd be able to move from this location to the Community Center. It would be fully operational for the entire facility, so it is a - a large unit, but something we don't have. And we'd also be able to utilize that for other Downriver communities through the Mutual Aid system if there's a need, that we have power but others do not. We'd be able to share with them as well.

Finally, we're - we are wrapping up - it's the end of the construction season. We're wrapping up some road projects, some things that you have actually allowed us to put - put forth - forward a couple months ago. Those projects are now wrapped up on the street improvements, and - and that'll go hand-in-hand with our road millage for next year. We've got additional block grant dollars that we need to put forth in a - after we budgeted additional money as

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well to put towards the road. So, we're - we're gonna be really focused next spring on roads. These people are gonna have to be understanding. There's gonna be a lot of barricades, but that'll be progress there.

And then, finally, we had some good news here. I think we announced maybe last time at the October meeting that Zeal Credit Union had named us the "hardest working city" in - in Metropolitan Detroit. A couple weeks ago, we were at the - you know, the local Mexican restaurant, and WCSX was there 'cause we were named the "city of the week" for - for that radio station. And then just last week, we were named - named the "second happiest city" in Michigan. So, things are going very well here, and - and the people enjoy living here, and I - I tell you, I think the - a lot of people - I enjoy working here as - and I know the other people as well. So, we're very excited. There's a - the future's looking very good.

And I - I just want to talk about the election a little bit that we had yesterday, and that - you know, we had Mayor Matakas reelected by a 62 to 38-percent margin. think - believe it's the first time that a mayor has been reelected in the last 20 years.

MAYOR MATAKAS: Twenty-five.

MR. SISKO: Twenty-five? Twenty-five.

So, that's a positive thing.

on the Council, Ms. McLeod and Mr. Rourke, are gonna be fantastic additions, and I think we're in good shape. And we passed a road millage, which says a lot about our city, and the trust that they have for us, which is headed by the Mayor and our City Administrator, and our previous City Administrator, which was Mr. Cady. And, I - I'd like at some point for everybody to consider looking at us as not being a financially distressed city anymore, and I - I pray that that happens in a short amount of time because we're ready. We have proven - if - and when you do the review, you're gonna see that we - I believe we've done all the
