This particular order deals with the disposition of the old City Hall property which required, the way that order was was structured, to sell it to a - a particular development group who has subsequently withdrawn their offer and their interest in that property. So what we are - are suggesting is that the order be amended to allow the City to, basically, go out and - and sell the - the - the property. They would seek competitive bids on it, and it would also require, which the City indicated if they wish to do, to get a full appraisal on the property as well as a survey. City has looked at this draft. They seem to be comfortable with it. I think it's - it's a way that we all get to where we need to be to move forward on this project.

22	MS. SCHAFER: So, we'll - we'll take each
23	resolution that that - each one separately. First would be
24	Resolution number 15 (dash) 0811 (dash) 0214, the C.E.
25	Raines Company Engineering Services contract. And I would

ask Mr. Cady if you could please provide the Board with some information on that.

MR. CADY: Thank you. At the end of June, early July, the City Council approved Administration to go to bid for engineering services, something that's not been done in the City in a long time. The City received five qualified bidders. Staff narrowed 'em down to the top three, which was Raines, Hennessey Engineers, and OHM. A committee was assembled which included the Building Director, the DPW Director, the Assistant City Administrator, and myself, along with three Council people, and we conducted extensive interviews with all three of those firms. When we were finished, C.E. Raines was the firm that came out on top of the - of the qualified bidders and received the recommendation of the group to the Council and was approved.

MS. BARANN: The term of the contract's 5 years?

MR. CADY: Yes.

MS. BARANN: Is that typical?

MR. CADY: Yeah, in - in - for - for Allen Park?

MS. BARANN: Well, the - how long as we term here?

MR. CADY: We couldn't find any contract for our previous City engineers or even any rates. There was nothing out there. And they did admit they'd been our engineer for at least 9 years and there'd never been any renewals or anything ever issued to them. So, it's filled

in - in an effort to bring a little bit of stability and get things forward. We would look at a 5-year contract to start with this firm.

MS. BARANN: Okay.

MR. CADY: We - we've -

MR. FRANK: The contract does that?

MR. CADY: - guaranteed the rates for the 5 years.

MS. BARANN: Yeah - yes, on the "termination provisions."

MR. FRANK: Okay, so before - I want to make a statement about this particular item. In the interest of full disclosure, as an attorney, I represented the City of Southgate in some matters regarding public roads and drains, and payment for those matters came through one of the bidders - other bidders, Hennessey Engineers. I've consulted with Treasury. We don't believe it's a conflict to vote on the approval of C.F. (Sic) Raines; but in interest of disclosure, I wanted to make that disclosure that that did happen to the - and that Hennessey Engineers did process my payments.

MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.

I - I do have one question for you, Mr. Cady, before I entertain a motion. It's my understanding that for Wade Trim they were paid a little bit over four hundred thousand dollars last year. I didn't see in my information

any comparison of costs for C.E. Raines. It -

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MR. CADY: Yeah, there - there was a sheet that was done with all of their charges, but - and - and the reason I didn't submit it was it - it's - it's hard to read. the charges are so much an hour for this function, so much an hour for this function, and it's a long page of - of rates. And so, they have a different rate if a guy's out inspecting a road versus if a quy's doing testing of concrete or - and - and so, it was like three pages of rates that we had to look at and break down. And when we looked at the - the three bidders, two of 'em were very close in their pricing. And depending on what functions the City's doing, the rates could be a little bit higher or a little bit lower. We - we think in the next year we'll probably gonna be doing a lot more road work than anything else in the City, and for that, Raines would be the best bidder of choice as far as pricing.

MS. SCHAFER: Okay. Thank you.

Any further questions or comments?

I'll entertain a motion.

MS. BARANN: I would move to approve Resolution 15-0811 (dash) 0214 for engineering services.

MS. SCHAFER: I'll support that motion.

Any further discussion or comments?

Hearing none, all those in favor of approving

Resolution number 15 (dash) 0811 (dash) 0214, the C.E.
Raines Company Engineering Service Contract, say "aye."

RTAB BOARD: Aye.

MS. SCHAFER: Opposed?

Hearing none, the Board's approved the Resolution 15 (dash) 0811 (dash) 0214.

Motion by Barann, support by Frank, to approve the Resolution 15-0811-0214, C.E. Raines Company Engineering Services Contract. Approved unanimously.

MS. SCHAFER: Don't go anywhere, Mr. Cady.

MR. CADY: I - I - I'm looking ahead. I'm -

MS. SCHAFER: The next item is Resolution number 15 (dash) 0811 (dash) 0220; that's the Gaydos Settlement. And we ask that you provide us information on that as well.

MR. CADY: I'll tell you as much as I can without disclosing some of the numbers. This was a - a case that stems from 2011 when the City entered into a contract with the deputy chief that basically enabled him to retire at the age of 38. The City realized its error - or somebody did, and again, I'm talking about history here that I've read. There was a dispute over his being able to leave. He subsequently sued the City and it's been in litigation almost 4 years. And when we went to - the trial was scheduled to start August 6th. The judge ordered us into

1	mediation. Through mediation, we were able to come to a
2	settlement that all parties agreed to. Council met in
3	closed session early - early last month and agreed to the
4	settlement. It in (sic) - it - it basically says the
5	Michigan Municipal League, through its insurance, will
6	supply approximately 20-percent of the settlement and the
7	City will pay the rest from fund balance. It also entitles
8 -	Mr. Gaydos to healthcare when he hits the age of 52.
9	MS. SCHAFER: Any questions for Mr. Cady?
10	MS. BARANN: I'll go ahead and move to approve
11	Resolution 15-0811-0220.
12	MR. FRANK: Support.
13 14	MS. SCHAFER: It's been moved and supported. Any further discussion?
15	Hearing none, all those in favor of - of approving

Other than a - a little stipend, an increase in their boots, and some changes that are monumental as far as not costing us a lot of money, there - there's - there's very little in that contract, and I believe I forwarded a copy of that to Treasury to review along with my spreadsheet of costs.

You asked the State; it was perfectly fine. soon you as you notif (sic) - noticed that that was fine, you turn around and you voted "yes." Ms. Parker was not here. I know - don't think that that vote was really the way to go with Ms. Parker missing, and that's the only thing I'm at (sic) - I'm against. When we, the citizens, wanted to have this meeting telecast, you guys actually turned around and tabled that, went back to the State and got permission from the State to go ahead and allow us to go ahead and to video. You didn't table the other one and you voted on something that you just got your hands on, my understanding. So at this time, I'm gonna ask you something really simple: The two individuals that have been note (sic) - been put up here by the Mayor, I would like them to step down, too. I'm not doin' this because I'm not - because of - I just don't like what's happening. We had a contract,
