MR. O'NEAL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the RTAB.

Several items if I may.

First, we're in a process of submitting at tonight's council meeting updated five-year budget. The five-year budget as presented to the RTAB and to council. I was not correct in relationship to our debt schedules and MERS payments. What happened, they were accurately reflected within the budget so we've got some modifications that had been taken in that regard and that will be forwarded on to you at a future meeting.

I'm just completing a letter to Wayne Workman on the completion of the task from his August letter to the city of Ecorse. We look forward to the end report of the RTAB that you would report favorably on the progress the city of Ecorse has made relative to those items that were in the previous RTAB assessment from a year ago. In the

letter Mr. Workman indicated that that would be delayed to such time as we were able to address some of those items.

You will note one of the -- we're in the process of having audit on our water system. We have an approximately 25 percent loss rate in our residential and we are hiring a company to come and take a look at our water system and go through our buildings, make sure all our homes are properly registered, that our accounts are right on that.

Also, you'll note, I believe you've got the minutes where there's a motion to terminate my employment from the city of Ecorse. And the vote failed on a 4 to 3 vote. That came on the heels of discussion relative to some actions that were being taken by the city of Ecorse and specifically some items that were taken by me as the city administrator. As you know, I was here on two different occasions; one from about five months ago and then back since February as appointed administrator. part of that I've identified a number of irregularities that have taken place within the city of Ecorse and were consenting at the ongoing investigation, many of which cannot discuss. But as it relates to the O'Brien Supermarket, at that council meeting, the Board entertained a motion to terminate my employment, ostensibly because of delays associated with the opening

of O'Brien's Market. As the TAB board is aware and council is aware, the project was delayed when I discovered and reported irregularities with the permitting and inspection process as well as incompatible zoning for the project site.

As city administrator I was obligated to identify and report these matters to assure compliance with state law and local ordinance. I am pleased to report that the proper permits have now been obtained and the inspection process is underway. The delay associated with this project was mandated by law. Any subsequent delay was a result of the property schedule and not the city of Ecorse.

The city council and the TAB board and the public can now rest assured that the construction process is in compliance with the law.

As I indicated earlier, Mr. Chairman, and members of the RTAB, I am required to facilitate any and all corrections to any irregularities that I may find and I continue to pursue that by and through Chief Moore, the controller's office, the Attorney General's office, anywhere that we have to go and we're doing that. We can rest assured that we are following through these processes in a proper manner and will continue to do that.

I will say to you that you know that this is the

election season here in Ecorse and as such there are candidates that have indicated that if they were to attain certain offices that the office of city administrator, public safety director and any other number of offices have been promised to other individuals within the community. Now, while I don't concern myself with that as it relates to my job function and my job evaluation that I might point out, I'm not sure if you've received that -- those minutes yet from the meeting which my evaluation was done.

So I would back up Mr. O'Neal with every decision he makes day-to-day every minute of the day for the city of Ecorse and like you're supposed to. So, thank you for your time.
