MS. SCHAFER: The first item is the resolutions from the regular city council meeting of November 24, 2015.

Now, I do want to mention to the Board that within that November 24 meeting there is Resolution Number 315 which is a series of, I believe, eight budget amendments. Just a reminder to the Board, I'd like to pull that resolution out separately because the Board does not approve that. We approve it or deny it — or make a recommendation to the treasurer. So we'll deal with that one separately if that's all right.

· With that said is there any discussion about the resolution from the city council meeting with the exception of Resolution 315?

MS. BARANN: And it's okay to go ahead and make that motion even knowing we had approved Resolution 305 and 314?

21	So at this time we'll address Resolution No.
22	315. It was regarding budget amendments and Pat do you
23	have anything that you would like to say or perhaps Mr.
24	Cady?

MR. CADY: I believe there's a series of seven

or eight budget amendments that go back to the council meeting of November 24th. Most of them are a series of ins and outs to amend the budget for items that happened or have been paid. The big one is the first one, obviously, which is to remove the bond fees from the general fund contingency into an account to segregate that. Obviously council's intent was not to incorporate those bond fees which have already been paid as part of the bonds and they amortize that over 15 or 20 years. So council's request that that be taken from general fund contingency and moved to an account so that it can be when we close out the SLP property account that money can be added back into the bond proceeds that we have left over.

The second transfer is basically to increase the budget and to actually add \$166,000 to the contingency and that's the money we got back from the state for the local community stabilization fund, the return of the personal property taxes.

The other ones are just mostly items like the holiday pay for the police contract. That wasn't in the original budget if you remember. The RTAB approved that contract back in September. We had to take money out of contingency to add to holiday pay to pay that. Utilities; we never anticipated that we'd be in that building as long as we were. We accumulated over \$51,000 in utilities.

The next transfer is to take care of that.

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The next transfer is basically to start closing out the SLP property account which you'll remember is 593. I want to take the money that we're going to get in land contract payments and move that over -- future land contract payments and move that over to the general fund.

The next item is basically just to increase the mayor and council accounts for the money that was granted them from the compensation commission. There was an extra \$2500 that we'll need to finish the fiscal year.

The next one is local streets and that's to account for the money that we'll be collecting with the approval of the millage for the roads and then lastly in 592 there was — the money was not encumbered and water and sewer for vehicles that were part of last year's budget didn't get purchased last year. They got purchased this year so we're asking that money be returned there. So that's the summary of the budget amendments that are before you.

M\$, SCHAFER: Thank you. Does the Board have any questions for Mr. Cady?

MR. WOLLENWEBER: Just to note that there is at least on my printed copy the bond fees are 536190. The contingencies is 526190. Think it's just a typo.

KIBBY: On 321, we did have a question that did come across from the state advisers and the city clerk is in the process of finalizing the vetting on those to make sure that they do not owe anything back to the city. There was one issue not directly that may have a tax issues that she's not directly involved with but she has some connection to.

MS. SCHAFER: Okay.

MR. KIBBY: So they're working on that right now. Other than that everybody else was fine.

MS. BARANN: Okay.

MR. FRANK: Given that in relation to the provision that is to serve on a commission or board one cannot be indebted to the city,

MR. KIBBY: Correct.

MS. SCHAFER: Further questions? I'll entertain a motion to approve, deny or postpone all the resolutions from the regular city council meeting of December 8, 2015.

24	have received the budget to actual report of November 15.

It's been received and filed.

Does the Board have any questions?

MS. BARANN: No.

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MS. SCHAFER: Then I'll move onto the next item which is the city administrator update.

MR. KIBBY: Good afternoon again.

Just a couple items I'd bring to the attention of the RTAB Board. Starting on Friday we will be open here at city hall. That was a change that Emergency Manager Parker had placed a number of years ago, I think probably about three years ago if I'm not mistaken.

So we will be open to the public on Fridays and with that the recreation office will no longer be closed for lunch and that started on Monday. So we tried to offer some more hours to the residents to make it more serviceable to them.

We did have the auction for the old city hall property last -- couple Thursdays ago, the 18th of December. Total generated was around \$24,000. There's still a few items over there for a pew or a chair or something if you had sat on we'd help you get it. But.

MR. MATAKA: Old computers.

MR. KIBBY: Old computers or anything like that. So we're still looking at a couple of the other items and see if there's still any value to do another auction or go from that point and just close it all in and move forth.

passenger bus. Just before Christmas time. This was a purchase, I think we -- the RTAB moved forth for us to allow for the moving with the block grant dollars. We purchased it with community development block grant dollars and that was the 12-passenger bus came in. We're still waiting for our five-passenger bus to arrive as well so they can do some more local moving of the people for the business such as doctors and so forth.

With that new equipment they're going to be changing the cell service to allow for a more of an ondemand type program. So the people will be able to call the day of, be able to get that service as opposed to scheduling it 24 to 48 or 72 hours in advance. So feel that's a nice added benefit to the residents.

For those that do a non-demand type service the day of, I think there's going to be \$1 more per charge. I think they'll be paying \$3 per delivery as opposed to \$2 so but it should make it a lot easier for family members not having to get them to the doctor. We'll be able to help them out.

The fire chief is working on two grants; one for a new pumper, a total of \$650,000 and a second for an exhaust removal system. That's about \$60,000. He tells us that the grants are going to be submitted at the end of

this week so we're keeping our fingers crossed on that. We're still waiting to hear back from the state on the other grants that we submitted for the distress community so we hoping that that information will be coming forth quickly as we've got a couple projects in there we're really anxious to get started on.

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We had 30 applicants for the police department position. After background checks we are down to 13 and we're now hoping to still be able to hire up to four officers. Of the 13 we may have lost another one or two out of those as well. So unfortunately it's just a —— it's tough out there. Everybody's trying to hire and I think the other problem is you have kids just aren't going into those criminal justice programs anymore. And it's just not a favorable time to be a police officer. Unfortunately the new media, you see it all the time. I just don't think the kids want to go into that type of program at this point in time. Hopefully that'll change in the future and we'll get more candidates at that.

The DPS is trying a new system out. They're going to be placing salt brine on the roads through spraying. So that's new for us here. Hopefully that will help lengthen the longevity of the roads a opposed to throwing tons and tons of salt on them so we're keeping our fingers crossed that this might be a benefit as we do

have the road millage. And we replaced new roads down so this is going to be an alternative that would hopefully help that.

Speaking of the roads, our engineers have been out. They've been doing some testing of the roads to determine the base and what the condition the bases are in so they can get started on those. We'll be getting those out to bid here, hopefully by the end of the month, first of February. And be ready to start as soon as the spring allows. I'm okay with the type of weather we're having now but we know that that's not going to hold out but as soon as the weather breaks in the spring we'll be ready to get started on those projects and show, hopefully do the best we can to show the residents that we are good stewards of their tax dollars and we do appreciate their faith in us.

We have a lot of work to build that trust back up with them.

One of the projects that we did work on back in the fall time was the Park Avenue resurfacing project. That did come in \$250,000 under budget so that was a nice positive change. That means we do not have to move a significant amount of the money from the major road fund balance over to cover that so we're in pretty good shape, still, on the major street fund.

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And finally, we've requested bids. We had a demolition order from the Court for a structure over on Allen Road that was in dire need of a demolition. bids will be due the next -- in two weeks then the 19th. And we'll look toward that on the 26th. In the meantime of asking for those demolition bids we've also asked for demolition price for the building next door. know where that's at at this point, see what we're looking

Other than that there's not been a whole lot Just not been very busy at all.

MS. SCHAFER: All right.

Any questions for Mr. Kibby?

(No response.)

MS. SCHAFER: Than you, Mr. Kibby.

Okay, that brings us to our next item, the Mr. Dostine?

MR. DOSTINE: Yes. Madam Chair we have two requests. The first one is Ms. Gail McLeod.

MS. MCLEOD: Well, happy new year to all of you.

MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.

MS. MCLEOD: I wanted to actually be last and I just wanted to make a comment that I know we got a calendar for your meetings for the entire year of 2016. But I have extremely high hopes that that is a very

abbreviated calendar and while we love you all dearly we would also not want to see you any more than we need to.

MS. SCHAFER: Stick around.

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MS. MCLEOD: So have a wonderful year and thank you very much.

MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.

MR. DOSTINE: Okay, Madam Chair, the next request is Mr. Ray Magusin.

MR, MAGUSIN: Happy new year to you all.

Couple things. I would like to see a line item on your agenda that before we start our meetings we have a pledge of allegiance to the flag. I think it's very important. The flag is right behind you. It doesn't take that long. These meetings are pretty short unless a lot of us get up here and talk but they are short. And I just think that it's a good thing for us to have.

Another thing that's very important to a lot of us is our commissions. Some of our commissions were terminated by Ms. Parker for whatever reasons. Some of them were put back on. Even our city council has asked for certain ones to be put back on. I would like to have an answer during your comments if possible of why we can't have some of our commissions to be put back as commissions for us. If our city council votes to have them, you know, put back on, whatever, what's the word you know I'm

1	looking for?
2	MS. SCHAFER: Reinstated.
3	MR. MAGUSIN: Reinstated.
4	Okay, and voted on. I think it's very important
5	that our commissions are very important to us. When it
6	comes time for our city to take our city back those
7	commissions are going to have to be refilled again so I'd
8	like to see them put back in, reinstated at this time.
9	And just to go ahead and say, hey either you can vote yes
10	or no or no, you don't really feel they're needed.
11	So thank you very much. Have a great day.
12	Thank you.
13	MS. SCHAFER: Thank you.
14	MR, DOSTINE: That concludes the public
15	comments, Madam Chair, Madam Ch
16	MS. SCHAFER: Thank you. The next item is Board
