| 25 | The Department of Treasury has reviewed the proposed five  |

year budget plan submitted by the city, and I'll introduce Mr. Cary Vaughn, who's the audit manager for the local government financial services division in the local government bureau, who, he and his staff reviewed the plan.

Mr. Vaughn, could you comment on the five year budget, please?

MR. VAUGHN: Yes, thank you, Mr. Chairman.

I just set and reviewed the five year plan. The city projects a balanced budget through 2020. Overall, the plan looks achievable; it looks good to us.

The city is beginning that period of time, meaning this fiscal year, with a \$4.6 million dollar unrestricted fund balance. That's a good start to the five years. We had several questions on the plan; they were all answered to our satisfaction. We really didn't have too many outstanding items on those questions.

Just a few of the highlights would be, the net pension liability is an area of concern, as the city has a \$25 million dollar net pension liability, although the city has included payments for the pension, as they should, in the five year plan. So they're not neglecting their duty to pay down that balance, so that should not be a, too large of a concern to the city, since they're making it into their five year plan.

Their other pension, their other pension benefits, or other post-employment benefits, such as retiree health care, that also had a \$25 million dollar balance. The last actuarial report was from 2011. That is past due, in our estimation; we should have had one at least in '14, so it's something that we might want to address as a department, to the city. But the 25 million may or may not be correct, because that was in 2011, so we don't know what it's done since then.

Just a few of the highlights, just briefly, they projected property taxes to remain flat from '16 to '21, after dropping 13 percent, from '15 to '16. Just keep in mind that we not only reviewed the five year plan, but we also reviewed it at -- to something in reality. So we reviewed it against the 2015 audit report.

So those numbers are real, and then we -- we did our analysis based on those 2015 numbers, and compared those to them, and so that, these, the projections seem realistic to us from '16 to '21.

The city has projected property taxes for police and fire was a 32 percent increase for '16, and they had said that they adjusted the millage from 15.9 to 24.4; that's why there's an increase in the millage rate for that.

Legal settlements kind of popped out at us a

bit, because in 2016, they're allocating zero dollars for legal settlements, but they had said that there were no outstanding nuisance settlements for '16, that \$350,000 was expensed in 2015 for outstanding future legal settlements. And so the 20 -- the zero amount for '16 seemed reasonable. They're budgeting \$100,000 in '17 through '21 for potential future legal settlements.

Another item that we looked at; we looked at a lot, but this is one of the highlights, is public safety expenditures were projected to remain relatively flat over the five year period.

Just one note, that you might want to keep in mind, while this is balanced for the next five years, the trick will be sticking to the five year plan. We noticed that in the 2015 audit, there were several items that went over budget, but then again they had several items that went under budget. So they were in that to the good by \$500,000 for '15.

But the thing is, is you really can't go over budget in your expenditure line items, that's against state law, so they really need to stick with that or amend the budget appropriately, before they go over budget.

So I think the object for the city, going forward, is to stick to the five year plan as closely as possible.

And if we can do some things in our DPW, our fire department, with our police department, you see the gun range on there. Whatever we can, we will move forward on that. Obviously, we know that only have so many places

left to cut or to save some monies. And hopefully, I'll 1 be coming forward with you with some appointments, things 2 like that, we'll even go further with that. 3 MR. Moore, I wasn't there. I don't know what they asked the mayor; I wasn't there. I know what they asked me, and I answered some questions very poignantly and confidently, and hopefully they come across in the spirit of which they were asked.

Knowing full well that some of the questions were asked before the election, and I was told that the answers wouldn't come out until after the election.

Because I don't get involved in elections. I see 'em and

that and I don't get involved with that.

But you know how that is. Comes across, well, what are you doing, so. Everything in my perspective is positive and Ecorse is on point. And I trust Mr. Moore and the mayor, obviously, they came along positive, but, again, the person that's the director of this is the same person that did Undercover Boss. And he's been nominated for Emmys and what have you, and he's quite a character. So we're looking forward to those two things.
