20	controller. When I was hired in, I was asked to review
21	the current budget. I went through the standard
22	schedules, I used our debt schedule, our capital asset
23	schedule. I used our BS & A to adequately predict our
24	property tax revenues.
25	I adjusted the MERS to our actual valuation

1	reports, that we can base our, use our payroll figures to
2	get that dollar amount. Biweekly payroll, I updated the
3	salaries for the different departments, and I implemented
4	the grant awards and expenses.
5	Based on those schedules, I amended the current
6	years' budget, which more accurately reflects the
7	schedules the city's currently using.
8	MR. KORYZNO: Any questions from the Board for Salowski Mr. Sedowski?
10	MR. BOVITZ: Did the treasury analyst have any
11	issues with the amendments, or was it just a formality?
12	Okay, I'm good.
13	MR. KORYZNO: Treasury in answer to your
14	question, Treasury didn't have any questions or concerns
15	about the budget amendment.
16	MR. BOVITZ: Okay, well I move that we approve
17	the Resolution 270.15, the budget amendment.
18	MS. BROPHY: Support.

3	So it's through no fault of the city, this is Treasury.
4	MR. BOVITZ: Okay. I'll move that we postpone
5	the adoption of Resolution 286.15, the five year budget.
6	MS. BROPHY: Support.

9	MR. BOVITZ: Well, I think this is because of
10	Sadowski has discovered the new information that Mr. Sedowski has discovered

21	City council has resolved its intent to maintain the
22	Ecorse Fire Department in its current form, and this
23	appears to be incompatible with the terms of a previous
24	communication with Deputy Treasurer Wayne Workman, which
25	the city council itself acknowledged, at its October 18th,

1 2015 council meeting.

Mr. O'Neal, could you provide some clarification for the Board, please?

MR. O'NEAL: Thank you, Mr. Koryzno, members of the TAB Board.

As you know, we just went through an election, and one of the issues within the election itself was, the fire department. They had got themselves involved in the election process. As you know, we were discussing mergers with the City of Ecorse -- excuse me, City of River Rouge.

Some -- a number of things that we were discussing but had not made any decisions or whatever. Those conversations were agreed to be kept confidential until such time as we could come to some resolve, based on our meetings that we had at the state level, and what have you.

River Rouge chose to not hold up to that, and had some information that went out to our fire department and they got involved in our election process. That being said, the council did not want to change the fire department as it currently is.

Now, what does that mean?

Does is mean that we keep a full time fire department, or does that mean that we have a part time fire department?

Do we have some kind of a combination?

And what they were trying to address to the public was, is that we are -- we realize that it's important that we have a fire department, and they want to maintain their fire department.

Nothing has come before my city council for them to even act on. So they came up with a resolution that, in its current form, that they have passed a resolution to keep it that way. We have had conversations, both with Lincoln Park and with River Rouge, relative to our fire department.

I've had conversations with Mr. Byrne, and Joe, regarding these things, and about how we might be going forward with this. It's still an active process. The City of Ecorse is not ignoring the agreement that we have with Mr. Workman, in his memo of, I think it's August 18th. We understand and we realize what we've got.

Keeping in mind the five year budget, had this a status quo budget, that you had before, that maintained the full time fire department. And it's perfectly balanced going forward. So that being said, we still have a work in progress and again, we're not turning our back on the memo with Mr. Workman. Randy indicated he wanted to talk with us next week as part of treasury, and we'll talk and we'll continue on that, and keep you informed,

1	Mr. Koryzno, as to what we're doing to keep our budget and
2	the fire department.
3	MR. KORYZNO: Thank you. Any questions from the
4	Board, for Mr. O'Neal?
5	MR. BOVITZ: Yeah, I think it's a harmless
6	resolution, in the spirit of the morale of the fire
7	department, but still you'd have to comply with whatever
8	budget you're forced to work with, or if there is a
9	consolidation agreement. And so I see no problem with the
10	resolution, because it's not dictating that things are
11	going to go in a certain manner that are outside the
12	memorandum of understanding.
13	MR. O'NEAL: Correct.
14	MR. BOVITZ: So, I have no problem with that
15	resolution.
16	MR. KORYZNO: Any other questions?
17	(No response)
18	MR. KORYZNO: Thank you, Mr. O'Neal.
19	Mr. Workman asked that Mr. Byrne address the
20	Board as well, so, Mr. Byrne?

MR. BYRNE: I am Randy Byrne. I'm the administrative manager of the office of fiscal responsibility.

As you know, on August 10th, there was a letter that Deputy Treasurer Workman sent to Mr. O'Neal, city administrator. And in this letter, it said, act quickly to consolidate its fire operations with a municipal neighbor such as River Rouge or Lincoln Park.

And what I am here to suggest is that if the city would like to study this issue, Treasury is willing to at least partially fund a study to take a look at what the options are for the City of Ecorse Fire Department. Consolidate with a city or cities, that's all on the table. So, I wanted to throw that out there as an option for the city to consider.

Thank you.

MR. KORYZNO: Thank you.

Mr. O'Neal?

MR. O'NEAL: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Byrne.
Mr. Koryzno, as you, again, as you realize, it's became a
very hot political potato, the fire department. I have
made it perfectly heard, known perfectly clear, to the
mayor and to council. As you know, the mayor and some of
the council did meet with Mr. Workman and the state

treasurer, relative to this issue, and we're cognizant of the fact that -- as well as in his memo, that we talked about the consolidation.

We're very, very aware of that, we realize it's something we've got to do in order to be sustainable as a community. That said, I appreciate the fact, and I know the mayor, and Mr. Elam is here -- will appreciate the fact that Mr. Byrne is here on the record, from Treasury, reiterating what Mr. Workman said in his memo. I made that perfectly clear.

But having him here today, to reinforce it, helps. Because it -- you know, we're under the gun, and we realize that, and we're going to do those things in that letter so that we get a good report card from the state, so, we're going to do what is necessary.

Thank you.

MR. KORYZNO: All right.

MR. BOVITZ: Well, you know, last year, the state offered the grant for the consolidation study, and we actually had to formally condemn the non-action of city council for not addressing it, so, hopefully this will readdress, then.

MR. KORYZNO: Any other comments?

I feel strongly that we should table the resolution, only because the letter says consolidation.

1	This says the city will maintain the fire department's
2	current form. I understand there is going to be
3	discussions and so forth, but I think, from my
4	perspective, to remain consistent with Treasury's
5	position, that's what we should do.
6	MR. BOVITZ: And the spirit at the time of the
7	resolution, and the city council politics that were going
8	on, and the morale issue, I think that was appropriate at
9	the time, but yet, for purposes of this meeting, I move
10	then that we table the resolution 286.15.
11	I'm sorry, 290.15, the fire department
12	resolution.
13	MR. KORYZNO: Thank you.

25	mayor and I have been working on a town hall meeting that

will take place next Tuesday, here at city hall. Where we, we're going to address a number of issues and bring the general public up to speed on what we're doing here in Ecorse.

We're going to talk about Mr. Workman's letter. I appreciate what was brought up today about the five year budget, and about Mr. Workman's memo. So I'm going to be discussing that in detail. And about the report that will be coming forthcoming, from the TAB board when you do your review of Ecorse and give us our little report card, and those types of things.

And as I told you a year ago, I still have it on my desk, and I use it as a road map, so that we can move Ecorse forward. The mayor is very, very aware of that, as well as the council people. So we have a town hall meeting that's going to address any number of issues, and I'll touch on a few of those as we go through.

As you -- as I brought the TAB board aware of some time ago, about a year ago, the -- we had a producer from California's interested in doing a reality show called "Downriver" here, in surrounding Ecorse and some of the downriver communities. And they did some filming. They've continued doing filming, and they've been back a couple, of three times.

I think they just about finished with it;

they're finishing the pilot. The reality show has been picked up by a studio, so it's going to be coming to -- some thing's coming to fruition. We have an agreement with the studio that it has to be approved by the city council.

Perhaps tonight, it's on the agenda for tonight. They've proposed to pay the City of Ecorse \$10,000 an episode for it. We're looking at having it -- an entertainment attorney look at the contract to make sure that everything is right and proper.

But the individual that is spearheading this thing, and I had an opportunity to Google his information, and he has been nominated for an Emmy award. He has done "Undercover Boss", he's done the Discovery Channel "Sharks," he's done the other one, where you are, "Locked Up Abroad", or something like that. He's done a lot of these different things. And he's quite known for what he does, and so we're curious to see how this thing comes out.

I know that the mayor and myself and the police chief, Mr. Moore, has been interviewed many, many times for many hours, and we'll see what happens with that. I get a kick out of that.

Anyway, as you know, our DPW superintendent has resigned. He had given us permission before to advertise;

we've done that on MML website. I'll be interviewing individuals for that position, and hopefully have somebody before you, before, at the January meeting.

I'm not sure how the time's going to go, so I beg you to bear with us on the timing, so that if I'm not exactly according to Hoyle on your timing, I'm trying.

You know how these things take. And Mr. Lawrence has been gone now for about a month, and so, well, we're doing what we can in house.

Some of the things that we're going to be talking about on the the town hall meeting is perhaps, a city attorney position. Bringing that in house, to try to reduce costs. We're going to talk about that.

Water department and certificates of occupancy, we have -- it's come to our attention that we have some large property owners that do not have certificates of occupancy. You'll notice on the -- in the minutes where we've got the residential dwelling and all that, so we're trying to attack the problems with the slumlords, and boarded up buildings and all those things.

We're trying to do some of those things. We're reviewing all the large property owners to make sure that they're compliant with their C of Os. It's come to our attention that they don't have water meters in their buildings. They've put straight pipes -- we're pursuing

this through legal channels. So we're not just picking on any one individual, but we're looking at a number of individuals, because it's becoming plainly apparent to us that this is widespread.

With that, we're also looking at doing a complete meter change out program, for the City of Ecorse. We're losing between \$700,000 and \$900,000 worth of water a year, so we're looking at doing that meter change out program so that we can approach this. It was noted in the 2008-2009 audit report, that we're losing somewhere around 115,000 units of water a year.

I don't believe that has been addressed, but we're addressing that now. And the only way to really do this is to do a meter change out program, so you can go to every house. We have to get in every house, and do that. And we're looking at back to -- a little less than a two year payback from the savings. And there's other efficiencies for that, as well.

And I've touched on briefly, before, about we're looking forward to the next Treasury review, and what the City of Ecorse has done going forward. With Mr. Workman's memo, with the TAB board, and getting Ecorse on the right path, and getting out from receivership and all working together and move us in -- into the same way.

We've got a majority, a super majority on

council, who wants to do the same thing. So it's all good. It's very good.

MR. KORYZNO: Any questions for Mr. O'Neal from the Board? I have one, does the city have a master meter, where all the water is measured when it comes into the city?

MR. O'NEAL: We have some large meters. I'd be remiss if I said yes. I know most cities do; I would believe that we do. We've got a handle on what we buy, and of course what we sell. And our loss rate is about 12.69 percent to overall. But, 50 percent of our water is used by United States Steel, so if you multiply that times two, we've got a 25 percent loss rate, in our residential area.

And we also have done a test, to take a look at the number of actual reads we get, and we're lucky to get 60 percent, 50 percent reads in our residential. So, you can see where the water's going.

MR. KORYZNO: Are the current meters electronic?

MR. O'NEAL: They're electronic but we can't get

reads, because they're straight pipes in there.

MR. KORYZNO: Oh.

MR. O'NEAL: And they've disconnected the touchpads, and they've done everything under the sun --

MR. BOVITZ: So you're not technically losing

the water, you're just not capturing the billing --

MR. O'NEAL: We're not capturing the billing, and we're --

MR. BOVITZ: So it's how collectible will the billings be, you know, that would go into your cost recovery study.

MR. O'NEAL: Well that's another issue, but right now, we're -- what we've got on the agenda tonight is to change the water rates. Because the water rate had been insufficient. So we've got a new water rate, that will allow us -- right now, our water rate gives 5,000 gallons away free. So the -- our minimum billing doesn't start until after 5,000 gallons.

So when they do do that tonight, you'll have a minimum bill plus, it starts metering from gallon one. So there's a number of issues that we're finding that's been going on for a long time, and we're gaining on it, but now that I've got Mr. Sedowski on board, he's helping me tremendously in that area.

There's lots of stuff to do, Mr. Koryzno.

MR. KORYZNO: I understand, very good. Thank you. Our next item is public comment, Mr. Van De Grift will call your name; at that time, approach the podium. Per the Board's policy, you'll have two minutes to speak, and Mr. Van De Grift will serve as timekeeper.
