

Governor Whitmer is focused on delivering for the Black community by getting things done on the issues that make a real difference in people's lives.

Building the most inclusive government in Michigan history

- Appointed more than 550 Black Michiganders to boards, commissions, and full-time positions. More than 60% of appointees are women or people of color.
- 28, or one-third, of judicial appointees are Black, including the first Black woman on the Michigan Supreme Court.
- Created the Black Leadership Advisory Council to help tackle racial inequity in Michigan.
- Vetoed bills that would have <u>disenfranchised</u> and <u>intimidated</u> voters.
- Signed legislation to make Juneteenth a state holiday.
- Signed the bipartisan <u>CROWN Act</u>, banning hair discrimination.
- Signed bipartisan bill recognizing May 2 as Negro Leagues Day in Michigan.

Growing Michigan's economy for all

- Secured 36,193 good-paying auto jobs and first auto plant in Detroit in nearly 30 years.
- Hired a Black-woman-owned firm to oversee \$3.5B Rebuilding Michigan Plan.
- Signed an executive directive raising diversity goal for state contracting dollars.
- Awarded \$370 million in construction contracts to firms owned and operated by people of color and women
 under MDOT's <u>Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program</u>.
- Lowered cost of car insurance and delivered \$400 refund checks per vehicle.
- Rolled back the retirement tax to save 500,000 households an average of \$1,000 a year.
- Quintupled the <u>Michigan Working Families Tax Credit</u> to give over 700,000 working families an average tax refund of \$3,150.

Empowering Michiganders, from cradle to career

- <u>Free preschoo</u>l to all eligible 4-year olds, including 8,600+ Black children, through the Great Start Readiness Program.
- <u>Expanded</u> access to free pre-K to every four-year-old while prioritizing families who need it most so every kid can arrive at kindergarten ready to learn.
- Expanded access to affordable child care for <u>150,000 more children</u>. Now, a family of four earning up to \$55,500 is eligible for free or low-cost child care.
- Raised per-pupil funding by \$1,729 since taking office, a 22% increase.
- <u>Closed the funding gap</u>, ensuring every school district has the same baseline funding and consistently dedicated more state resources to students with the highest needs.
- Funded programs like <u>Reconnect</u>, <u>Futures for Frontliners</u>, and <u>Michigan Achievement Scholarship</u> to provide hundreds of thousands of Michiganders tuition-free higher education or skills training that leads to a high-skill, good-paying job.

Reforming criminal justice and prioritizing public safety

- Signed "Clean Slate" bills making hundreds of thousands of Michiganders eligible to have their records expunged, expanding their opportunities for jobs and housing. Invested millions of dollars to assist returning citizens with expungement.
- Signed <u>Clean Slate for Kids</u> to seal juvenile court records from public view and create a process to automatically
 expunge records for those who do not commit future offenses.
- <u>Called on the legislature</u> to ban chokeholds, limit no-knock warrants, require independent investigations of police shootings, classify false, racially motivated 911 calls as a hate crime, mandate retention of disciplinary records resulting from improper use of force.

Addressing health inequities

- Established the <u>Racial Disparities Task Force</u> and made <u>"lasting structural change."</u> Released <u>a report</u> detailing progress made and actions still to be taken to close disparities.
- <u>Made investments</u> to reduce disparities, including Sickle Cell treatment, and <u>invested</u> nearly \$50 million to implement their recommendations.
- Consistently <u>invested</u> in <u>Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies</u>, an initiative to address disproportionate racial impacts of maternal and infant mortality.
- Declared <u>racism a public health crisis</u> and required all medical professionals to undergo <u>unconscious bias training</u> to improve healthcare and target disparities

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
