

# MICHIGAN'S COVID-19 VACCINATION DISTRIBUTION

During World War II, Michigan became the arsenal of democracy - building tanks and bombers to defend freedom and crush fascism. This year, we stepped up as the arsenal of health - manufacturing masks, ventilators, and PPE. And we were the epicenter of hope when the world watched the Pfizer vaccine roll out of Portage, Michigan. The State of Michigan has performed over 9.5 million tests, which makes us 7th in the nation. And despite many challenges, the state has made great strides in vaccine distribution. The governor worked with health care leaders to prioritize our brave health care workers, our educators, seniors, and vulnerable populations most at risk. And she created the bipartisan Protect Michigan vaccine commission to ensure the state gets this right. Michigan is now in the second wave of distributing safe, effective vaccines. Two weeks ago, Michigan was 9th in the nation in vaccines administered and 32nd in those administered per 100,000 residents. Now, Michigan is 6th and 14th respectively.

## **GOAL #1: GET AT LEAST 70% OF MICHIGANDERS AGE 16 AND OLDER VACCINATED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE**

- That means getting 5.6M residents vaccinated as soon as possible.

## **GOAL #2: GET 50,000 SHOTS IN ARMS EACH DAY AS SOON AS THE STATE HAS THE SUPPLY WE NEED**

### **WHAT THE STATE IS DOING:**

- Working with Healthcare systems and Local Health Departments to provide safe and effective vaccines across the State .
- Partnering with pharmacies to vaccinate skilled nursing and long term care residents.
- Providing Michigan National Guard support for data and administering vaccines.
- Packaging and sending PPE shipments across the state.
- Launching 211 and providing vaccine appointment applications for providers that may need help with technology and those without access to broadband.
- Partnering with private organizations to secure spaces for vaccination clinics.
- Investing in mobile units to go to our vulnerable populations and shut ins.
- Registering providers across the state to help put more vaccines in arms in each community when supply increases.
