Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects (NSFLTP) supports the construction, reconstruction, and rehabilitation of transportation near Federal and Tribal lands



Goals and merit criteria for NSFLTP grants:

Grant will provide funding for initiatives that support transportation aligned to various merit criteria:

- Advances DOT goals of safety, state of good repair, economic competitiveness, and quality of life
- Improves condition of critical transportation facilities, including multi-modal facilities
- Needs investment for construction, reconstruction, or rehabilitation
- Included in the National Register of Historic Places
- Uses new technologies and innovations which enhance efficiency of the project
- Avails other funds to construct, maintain, and operate the facility
