



Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery Grant Funds (CDBG-DR)



MI application deadline: 05/04/2026



Available funding: \$43.6M for Michigan (\$34.9 for Public Infrastructure and Public Facilities, \$6.5M for Planning Program)

CDBG-DR funds disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization, and mitigation



Goals and merit criteria:

Michigan's funds for this round will be awarded to eligible projects and planning activities within the identified HUD and State MID counties of Eaton, Ingham, Macomb, Monroe, and Oakland. Funding will be split between the Public Infrastructure and Public Facilities program and the Planning program.

The application process will require applicants to demonstrate, at a minimum, how the funds will accomplish the following objectives:

- Promote sound, sustainable long-term mitigation planning informed by a post-disaster evaluation of hazard risk, especially land-use decisions that reflect responsible floodplain management and consider future possible extreme weather events and other natural hazards and long-term risks.
- Coordinate with other local and regional planning efforts to ensure consistency and promote community-level and/or regional (e.g., multiple local jurisdictions) mitigation planning.
- Integrate mitigation measures into all projects and achieve objectives outlined in regionally or locally established plans and policies that are designed to reduce future risk to the jurisdiction.
- Activity/Plans benefit the HUD/State MID area.
- Budget is comprehensive, reasonable and that other funds, if included, are under the control of the applicant.

Eligible Entities

- Local governments
 - Public Infrastructure & Public Facilities: MEDC will use competitive rounds to award funds to eligible projects being completed by eligible units of general local governments.
 - Planning: MEDC will be using a first come, first service process to award funds to eligible plans and activities being completed by eligible units of local governments.
