

Railroad Crossing Elimination (RCE) Grant Program



Application period (previous year)¹: 7/6/2022 - 10/4/2022



Available funding (previous year): \$575M

RCE provides funding for highway-rail or pathway-rail grade crossing improvement projects that focus on improving the safety and mobility of people and goods



Goals and merit criteria for RCE grants:

FRA will consider the extent to which the projects address the following DOT Strategic Goals:

- safety;
- equitable economic strength;
- improving core assets;
- equity and barriers to opportunity;
- climate change and sustainability;
- transformation;
- eliminating crossings and making corridor-wide improvements;
- · geographic diversity

RCE Program Details

RCE is a moderately competitive program with a 40% award rate, and ~50% of the awards going to small planning grants under \$1M

Match funding requirement: 20%

West Side Grade Separation Project (2022)

Applicant: City of Monroe

Impacted locality: City of Monroe

Funding: \$24M

Project description: The proposed project will complete project development activities, right-of way acquisition, final design, and construction of the Monroe West Side Grade Separation and Traffic Safety Improvement Project to eliminate an existing grade crossing and construct a new grade separation with CSX.

RCE goals and merit criteria addressed:

- · Improve roadway traffic flow on the west side of Monroe
- · Improve safety response times for emergency vehicles



Manistee County Safer Southern Rail Route (2022)

Applicant: Manistee County

Impacted locality: Manistee County (rural)

Funding: \$424K (planning)

Project description: The proposed planning project will support a track relocation study to abandon a northern perimeter track around Lake Manistee for a new southern segment.

RCE goals and merit criteria addressed:

- Elimination of four at-grade crossings
- Elimination of three marine bridges
- Elimination of a rail car staging area on CSX right-of-way

What you will need to apply for a RCE grant

RCE grants are open to a range of public entity applicants, and requires a moderately thorough application; it does not include a BCA and the NOFO does not distinguish requirements between capital and planning grants



Eligible Entities

- States and the District of Columbia
- Local government
- Unit of local government or a group of local governments
- Federally recognized Indian Tribe
- Public port authority
- Metropolitan planning organization
- Group of the entities described above



Key Application Components¹

25-page application limit²

- Project description
- Statement of work
- Project location information identifying impacted location (e.g., file like ShapeFile, or decimal format)
- · Project budget and funding information
- Narrative of how project meets selection criteria and DOT goals

- Project readiness narrative
 - Project schedule and milestones
 - Describe past experience in managing and overseeing similar projects
 - Environmental readiness
 - State the status of the NEPA application process (not started, started, complete)

- 1. Not the requirements to apply for TAC support. Not inclusive of all documents required to apply; please refer to NOFO for the full requirements and details
- 2. Excluding supporting documents
