The Whitmer-Gilchrist administration has invested in every region of Michigan to deliver on the kitchen-table issues that matter most to families, communities, and small businesses.

Growing the Bay Region's economy

- Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) investments:
 - Over \$25 million invested to support over 30 Business Development projects projected to create over 400 jobs and leverage over \$400 million in private investment.
 - \$57 million to support over 20 Community Development projects, leveraging more than \$20 million in private investment and reactivating more than 1 million square feet of public space.
- Delivered \$18 million to support over 2,000 businesses and retain more than 16,000 jobs through COVID, with 64% of relief going to geographically disadvantaged areas.

Empowering workers in the Bay Region

- 5,300 Michigan Reconnect applicants in the Bay Region are on tuition-free paths to higher education or skills training.
- 6,421 Futures for Frontliners in the Bay Region who served on the frontlines of the pandemic have been accepted to get on tuition-free paths to receiving a diploma or attending community college.
- Created 1,497 knew registered apprenticeships with a focus on supporting opportunities for underrepresented populations: veterans, women, people of color, those with disabilities, and young Michiganders.
- COVID relief:
 - Saved 2,297 jobs with Workshare program which allowed employees to collect unemployment benefit while working part-time.
 - Set up eight virtual job fairs connecting 248 employers to over 520 job-seekers.

Fixing roads, bridges, pipes, and parks in the Bay Region

- Fixed 1,026 lane miles of road and 102 bridges, supporting 3,660 jobs.
- Invested \$5.5 million to upgrade or repair state and local parks.
- Invested \$20.4 million into water infrastructure in the Bay Region to upgrade sewer systems, replaced lead pipes, and protected safe drinking water for families.

Investing in students and schools in the Bay Region

- Increased per-student funding by \$809 for the 111,000+ students in Mid Michigan since taking office.
- Expanded free preschool through the Great Start Readiness Program to 655 more kids in the Bay Region.
- Raised childcare funding per kid in the Bay Region by 169%.

Building housing and keeping families in their homes in the Bay Region

- Constructed 375 affordable, attainable housing units.
- Helped 853 families with mortgages and down payments.
- Kept 4,541 families in their homes with rental and utility assistance.

Proposals to cut taxes for seniors and working families in the Bay Region

- Governor Whitmer's proposal to roll back the retirement tax would save 34,300 families in the Bay Region an average of \$1,000 a year, putting \$34.3 million back in people's pockets and the local economy.
- Governor Whitmer's proposal to triple Michigan's Earned Income Tax Credit would deliver an average combined tax
 refund of \$3,000 to 46,000 working families in the Bay Region, putting \$138 million in people's
 pockets and the local
 economy.
